**The training costs are sponsored by G4** and include grades E, D and C. As soon as the candidate has completed grade E, the company does the PSIRA application on behalf of the client, and this cost is also

absorbed by group4.

Upon the successful completion of all three grades, G4 employs them.

We are waiting to see who graduates.
